Incoming students are supposed to take two modules from module group B (24 ECTS), two modules from module group C (16 ECTS) and 20 ECTS from electives listed in the curriculum. In total: 60 ECTS.

Incoming students are supposed to take one of the five specialization subjects of 25 ECTS compulsory subjects and 10 ECTS of elective subjects. Moreover, they will be granted 30 ECTS for their thesis. In total: 65 ECTS.

Incoming students need to take 22 ECTS of compulsory subjects, 4/4 ECTS of elective subjects/elective modules, 30 ECTS for working on and defending the thesis. In total: 60 ECTS.

Nomination Deadline

winter semester / academic year: 30 April

Application Deadline winter semester / academic year: 1 June

PROOF OF LANGUAGE SKILLS

For being accepted as a student at TU Graz, you have to prove an English Level of at least **Level B2** according to CEFR.

ACCEPTED PROOF

- Certificates/Statements that have been issued by a Language Center, Language Institute or International Office of your university
- TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS or Cambridge Certificate
- In some cases, other proof than listed above can also be accepted. Students should reach out to Exchange Coordinator at TU Graz to sort out individual cases.

In general: Certificates should not be older than two years!

APPLICATION PROCESS

1. APPLICATION through Mobility Online

(Login data will be sent to the student after Exchange Coordinator has received nomination by the home university)

2. AFTER STUDENTS HAVE RECEIVED INVITATION LINK for the

online application, they need to complete their application on Mobility Online.

Documents to be uploaded in Mobility Online by students:

- ✓ Portrait picture
- ✓ Copy of passport
- ✓ Proof of language qualification
- ✓ Transcript of Records
- ✓ Signed online application form
- ✓ Bachelor's degree certificate

3. International Office at TU GRAZ will CHECK THE APPLICATION

4. After check was successful and students have been accepted (usually around June-July), students can **DOWNLOAD LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE** via Mobility Online and receive their **PRE-ARRIVAL GUIDE** with information on accommodation, insurance, living in Graz, Orientation Sessions and much more.

HOUSING

Students can book their housing on their own and have a choice between different housing options such as OeAD housing (specially designed to meet the needs of exchange students, duration from one month), student dorms, private rented flats or private shared flats.
